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PROTECTIVE SERVICES / HOMELAND SECURITY

Course Description:

Students will learn the technical knowledge and hands-on skills required for entry-level duties as police officers, firefighters, paramedics, military service, and other safety services professions. Especially in emergency and disaster situations. Physical development, discipline, and self-confidence are emphasized due to the nature of the specific occupations. Advanced-level students receive training in social and psychological skills, map reading, vehicle and equipment operations, the judicial system, pre-hospital emergency medical care, appropriate emergency assessment, treatment, and communication. Students have the opportunity to earn their CPR, First Aid, AED, NIMS, PATH, PPBT, OCAT, and Personal Protection Control and defense certifications.

Students who wish to continue in this field should continue their education at a two or four-year college, or join the military service. Security officer positions may not require any additional education.

Average pay: According to Salary.com, the average salary for Police Officer is \$55.600 Firefighter is \$46.595 Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) is \$36.12.

Protective Services/Homeland Security level II and level III students can compete in various areas.
